## Read your partner's draft OUT LOUD to them. Make notes on the following aspects and discuss them with your partner. Take your time! Talk!

- 1. Does the author's *description* give you get a clear mental picture of the ad? After you read the description, look at your partner's ad. What was effectively described? What could be clarified? How?
- 2. According to the author, when/where was this ad published, and who is the *target audience* for the ad? Do we hear about their values/fears/desires? Is more information/clarification necessary? What could be explained further? Why and how?
- 3. Based on the author's description/initial analysis of the ad, what messages/meanings seemed to be the most obvious?
- 4. Based on the author's analysis of the ad, what were the most unexpected/latent/interesting meanings? What deeper meanings, cultural myths, social issues, etc., has the author revealed?
- 5. What is most interesting/impressive about this draft?
- 6. Based on the author's description and analysis, what do you think of this ad? Do you think the author was thinking critically or just on the surface? Are there other elements of the ad or potential cultural myths that haven't been explored?
- 7. What would you recommend/questions do you have (where you want more, feel like you need less?
- 8. Respond to the author's question.
- 9. Reread the title. How do you think the author felt about their critique? Do you think the title fits the paper, or could it be better? If the author hasn't included one, what might be an effective title?
