## Peer Review: Proposal Argument Presentation

- 1. What was really working in this presentation? (Explanations, descriptions, information, tone, medium, arrangement, images, etc.)
- 2. What is most compelling/interesting/enlightening about the problem/solution?
- 3. Respond to the author's question.
- 4. As the presenter continues to work on this project, what are some questions, thoughts, or suggestions they ought to consider (this can be *new questions* to research, *further aspects* to explore, *complications* to address, where to expand/cut, consider the target audience, etc.)

## **Reflect/Revise.** Once you have completed peer review, respond to the following questions and post on the Peer Review blog. Use the remaining time to work on revisions.

- 1. Now that you have heard your draft read aloud and received feedback, what advice is most helpful?
- 2. How do you plan to address this?
- 3. What is the most effective part of your presentation so far?
- 4. What will be your focus for revision (1-3 points) and what is your plan to address them?
