1. What is most compelling about the *problem*?
2. What *complications* are addressed?
3. If clear at this point, what is really working with the *solution*?
4. Respond to the author's question.
5. Reread the title. How do you think the author felt about their critique? Do you think the title fits the paper, or could it be better? If the author hasn't included one, what might be an effective title?

Reflect/Revise. Once you have completed peer review, respond to the following questions and post on the Peer Review blog. Use the remaining time to work on revisions.

1. Now that you have heard your draft read aloud and received feedback, what advice is most helpful?
2. How do you plan to address this?
3. What is the most effective part of your draft so far?
4. What will be your focus for revision (1-3 points) and what is your plan to address them?
