Preface

This is a listing of the almost two thousand articles and reviews that have appeared in the *Slavic and East European Journal* during its first decade and a half of publication. They are arranged alphabetically by the author of the article or the book reviewed (for collective reviews, by the author of the first book reviewed) and are numbered. In the same alphabetization are also given all of the other names contained in the main entry: reviewers, coauthors, editors, translators, and so on. The number following the name refers to the main entry where the name occurs. This is an index of names; it is a subject index only to the extent that when the subject of an article or of a book reviewed is a literary figure (whether named in the main entry or not), there is also a cross reference from that literary figure. (To offset this imbalance in favor of literature study, a language index has been appended to the main index.) Cross references are undifferentiated, with one exception: references from the name of the reviewer to the main entry listing the review are labeled "rev."

Two Volumes 15 are indexed here, and no Volume 1 or Volume 2. The explanation is the following. The *Slavic and East European Journal* is the successor to AATSEEL's *Bulletin* (1943-53) and the *AATSEEL Journal* (1954-56). Volumes 1 and 2 are actually Volumes 15 and 16 of the official AATSEEL publication and are so labeled in this *Index*. At the annual meeting in 1958 it was decided that *SEELJ* constitutes a new series of AATSEEL publications, and accordingly Volume 17 was parenthetically designated New Series, Volume 3. The volume for 1960 was called New Series, Volume 4 (18), and for 1961 New Series, Volume 5 (19). Thereafter, they are simply Volume 6 (1962), Volume 7 (1963), etc.

The system used of cross reference by number unfortunately necessitates a good deal of page turning. However, to have carried out the original plan calling for unnumbered main entries and longer, more informative cross references would have swollen this booklet to several times its size. In preparing the *Index*, main entries had to be added, deleted, and renumbered. As a result a certain percentage of the numbers

may be slightly off. It is hoped that the user will find the entry sought, if not in its exact place, at least nearby.

In spring 1967 a ten-year index to *SEEJ* was planned by Robert W. Simmons, Jr., of the University of Wisconsin, who was then Managing Editor. It was to have been published by the University of Wisconsin Press, which had been publishing the *Journal* since 1965. The first ten years of materials were compiled by Leslie F. Bailey, also of the University of Wisconsin. Work on the index was suspended a year later, and the materials were forwarded to Urbana shortly after the editorial offices moved to the University of Illinois in winter 1970-71. The first ten years were put into their present form and the additional five years were compiled. This was largely the work of Mardelle L. Eide, Graduate Assistant for *SEEJ* 1970-72, but considerable assistance was received from students whose wages were subsidized under the U.S. Office of Education College Work-Study Program. The *Index* was typed by Kathleen S. Spaulding on funds provided by the Research Board of the U. of I. Graduate College. Publication of the *Index* is made possible in part by the generous support of the U. of I. Russian and East European Center (Ralph T. Fisher Jr., Director). The Department of Slavic Languages and Literatures (Clayton L. Dawson, Head) has also supported its publication, just as it supports other aspects of work on *SEEJ*.
