Preface

The present volume is the catalogue of periodicals that belong to the Hakkı Tarık Us Collection, currently kept at the Beyazıt State Library in Istanbul. The Hakkı Tarık Us Collection, consisting of valuable books, journals, newspapers, yearbooks, almanacs, and salname's, is being repaired, classified, registered and digitized since 2003. Digitizing Ottoman period periodicals, as well as preparing a catalogue of all of the periodicals, was jointly carried out by the Beyazıt State Library and the Tokyo University of Foreign Studies between 2003 and 2007, and between 2009 and 2010. The first catalogue of the Collection's periodicals was published in 2006 under the name of Hakkı Tarık Us Kütüphanesi Kataloğu: Süreli Yayınları, with the support of the Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality. The purpose of this second catalogue is to supplement and correct the first one, and to show which journals are available in the form of digitized data.

As is well known, the Hakkı Tarık Us Collection is one of the best private collections of books and periodicals. After Mr. Hakkı Tarık Us (1889-1956) passed away, an independent library was founded within Sibyan Mektebi of the Beyazıt comlex to keep the collection, which was managed by a newly founded vakıf. For many years, this library was visited by numerous researchers and readers. Yet, in order to ease its administration, in 2003, it was decided that the library should be transferred to the Ministry of Culture and Tourism, and, consequently, began to be kept in the Beyazıt State Library. During its preservation at this library, the Center for Documentation and Area-Transcultural Studies of the Tokyo University of Foreign Studies proposed a joint project with the Turkish Ministry of Culture and Tourism, for the preservation and utilization of the Hakkı Tarık Us Collection. With the signing ceremony on August 25, 2003, the "Project for Preservation and Digitization of Periodicals in the Hakkı Tarık Us Collection" was started. After an interruption between 2007 and 2009, the project was continued within the framework of the

"Research and Educational Project of the Middle Eastern and Islamic Studies" at the same university, before being completed as a whole in March 2010.

Many people contributed to this project. Among them, we dearly thank Mr. Abdurrahman M. Haciismailoğlu and Mr. Muhammed Hızarcı for their painstakingness in the digitising work. We are also indebted to Mr. Selahattin Öztürk for the preparation of this catalogue.

We would like to express our gratitude to Prof. Dr. Mustafa İsen, the Secretary of the Ministry of Culture and Tourism at that time and Prof. Dr. İskender Pala for their support. The present catalogue is dedicated to Mr. Şerafeddin Kocaman, the former president of the Beyazıt State Library, who started the project, but passed away in December 2009.

The digitized data of the Ottoman periodicals are kept in the Beyazıt State

Library and in the Tokyo University of Foreign Studies. Periodicals already digitized are

marked with an asterisk (*) in the catalogue. Another project for making these data

available to the public is currently in progress (http://www.tufs.ac.jp/common/library/htu/).

By undertaking such actions as above, we are honored to, in someway, be able to answer

Mr. Hakkı Tarık Us's wish to hand over his legacy to future generations.
