EDITOR'S PREFACE

The purpose of this publication is to facilitate bibliographical access to post-World War I newspapers from East Central and Southeastern Europe in the collections of the Library of Congress. It embraces newspapers issued during the period from 1918 to date within the present territorial boundaries of Albania, Bulgaria, Czechoslovakia, Hungary, Poland, Rumania, and Yugoslavia, and newspapers issued in Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania from 1917 to the date of their initial occupation by the Soviet Union in the summer of 1940.* Both bound volumes and microfilms are included.

The arrangement is alphabetical by country, except that Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania are listed alphabetically as subheadings under the general heading "Baltic Countries." Places of publication are listed alphabetically under each country, and titles alphabetically under each locality. Save for a few cases where accepted English versions exist, geographic names are spelled in accordance with their official listing by the U. S. Board on Geographic Names. Cross references are provided from alternate spellings to those used herein. A title index, a language index, and a guide to places of publication are provided. Titles in languages using the Cyrillic alphabet are transliterated according to the Library of Congress system, with the exception that discritical marks have been omitted for Bulgarian and Russian.

In addition to the latest place of publication, the most recent title, and Library of Congress holdings, the following data, if ascertainable, are supplied for each newspaper: date of establishment; frequency of issue; latest known names of issuing body, publisher, and/or editor; and any identifiable changes in these elements. The language is given for each newspaper published in Czechoslovakia, Lithuania, and Yugoslavia; for the other countries, see the explanatory notes on pages 1, 4, 8, 13, 70, 91, and 126. Current receipt of a newspaper by the Library of Congress is indicated on the title line by a plus sign following the date of establishment. A plus sign following a date under the microfilm heading indicates that the title has been filmed on a

continuing basis since that date, and that present plans provide for the pursuance of this microfilming program.

Holdings are itemized and identified by date, or-exceptionally-by number. For the sake of brevity, in some cases the identification of missing issues replaces the indication of holdings. Dates of issues which could not be established positively are given in brackets.

The record of holdings given herein is based chiefly on files maintained by the Library's Serial Division, whose cooperation is gratefully acknowledged. The bibliographical data were established through de visu examination and/or consultation of the reference materials shown in the List of Sources.

The compilation of this bibliography was a joint project of the staff of the Slavic and Central European Division. It was begun under the editorship of Alfred C. String, Jr., former Curator of the Slavic Room. The following present and former division staff members compiled the individual sections:
