
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#### ABOUT THE EDITOR

During his stay at Indiana, he has made several trips to Eastern Europe and Russia to purchase materials, establish library exchanges, and prepare this handbook. Previously he worked as a compiler for the MLA bibliography, taught Russian and Czech at the University of North Carolina, taught Slavic bibliography at Indiana University, translated several articles from Russian, and coauthored a book on the history of Czech publishing. He has participated in numerous Slavic conferences.
