More than 2000 books were offered for student selection the first day. Other books were ordered each day to meet the demand. On Thursday a large selection of Spanish language books were also put on sale.

Popular selections were books from television and movie films such as Man from U.N.C.L.E., Mad Squad, True Grit. Charlie Brown and the Peanuts gang were top sellers along with joke and riddle books. Average cost for books was 50¢ with prices ranging from 30¢ to \$1.65.

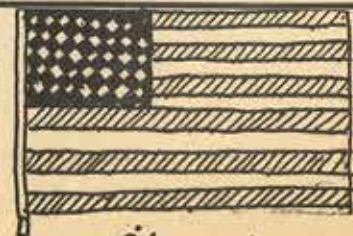

Thinks the food is ok. Yvette, likes to play basketball. She hates the noon movies shown.

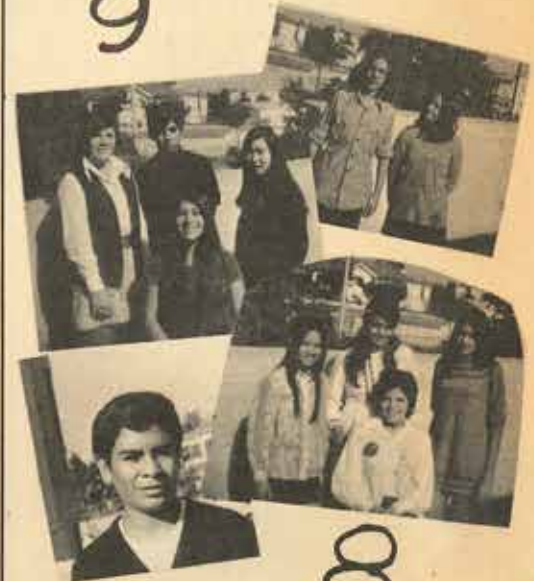
She watches: Mod Squad, Room 222, Hawaii Five-O, etc... Yvette, listens to K.G.F.J.
