## CAMERA SHOTS

Below is a list of sample shots that you can use in your piece. Remember you want to have pictures that reflect all of these kinds of shots to have your story pop. Please collect up to 15-30 pictures for your piece. These pictures can come from a scanner, the internet or a camera.



**Wide Shot:** Used to establish a scene by showing location and characters. This can include landscapes, banners, or offices. Make sure to include details like street or city names, address numbers, etc.
