


NEW PLEDGE CARD SYSTEM

C L N A PLEDŒ CARD SYSTEM

Upon the urgent request of chapters, groups and individuals throughout the United States, the following SYSTEM, which consists of three printed forms, has been adopted:

1. The Pledge-card, which is retained by the pledgee.

2. The Stamp-folder, which is kept by the person soliciting.

3. The Pledge-record, (ledger sheet), which is also kept by the solicitor

and eventually by the CLNA as its permanent record.

Each DIVISION is expected to assist us in arranging for proper distribution of cards, stamp folders (with stamps) and pledge-records, among sub-chapters, groups, committees, and/or individuals. A "live-wire" solicitor or collector should be appointed within each group or committee accepting the forms. Each Division will be held responsible for stamps received. Funds received from pledge-collections must be shown SEPARATELY on the monthly financial statements, in order that proper credit can be given the respective division.

It will be noted that the minimum membership fee is \$1.00 per month, however, the system is so arranged that an individual may purchase a larger number of stamps

in any one month, and receive credit accordingly.

PROCEDURE OF SOLICITING AND ACCOUNTING. The solicitor should have several pledge-cards and at least one stamp-folder with him at all times. A new pledgee is required to sign the collector's pledge-record as well as his own pledge-card. Be sure that these two forms bear the identical number for each pledgee.

Whenever a pledge is collected, or stamps sold outright, be sure to make proper notations in the stamp-folder, i.e.; date, number of stamps or amount, and card number. These particulars can then be transferred to the proper pledge-record

when convenient.

The pledge-record sheets may be kept in an inexpensive loose-leaf note book

cover, as the sheets are punched to fit a standard size book.

THE STAMP SYSTEM, it was felt, was to be preferred over other pledge-systems, inasmuch as an audit can readily be made without calling in individual pledge-cards.

NEWS For the past three weeks the sky over Toronto has been clouded with formations of Norwegian fighter planes training day and night. The people of this large city know that another class in advanced training is being conducted by the Norwegian Air Force and that a new group of pilots trained in Canada is ready to go over-seas to action. These pilots took their elementary training at Little Norway, their intermediate training in the Middle West at Canadian Schools, and finally returned to Little Norway to complete their training on combat planes. ...- Lieutenant Colonel Cle Reistad, Air Officer Commanding the R.N.A.F. in Canada, recently inspected formations as they flew over the city. He declared afterwards that this demonstration was the finest he has seen during the whole of the time that Norwegian pilots have been trained in Canada. ... - ... In a fight over the Channel Friday, June 19th, members of a Norwegian squadron shot down three German fighter planes and danaged four others and sank two enemy patrol boats. One Norwegian pilot, Lieutenant Muller, was lost. Two pilots are officially credited with shooting down one Messerschmidt 109. Six pilots have been credited with damaging five Messerschmidt 109's and probably destroying a sixth as well as one Junkers-88. Because of relatives in Norway we cannot mention the names of the pilots ...- ...- A nineteenyear old pilot fighting in an R.A.F. squadron has been credited with shooting down one Focke Wulf 190, the latest type of German fighter, and damaging another of the same - NORWAY FIGHTS ON ! Special honors go to Mrs. Edward Nubson of Minneapolis, Minn. A LADY WHO REALLY WORKS Ever since she heard the heroic Saga of Toronto she has given all her effort and burning enthusiasm to work for this cause. Her shining record so far includes: Profit donated from selling Christmas Cards \$30.00, a silver tea in her home, netting \$50.00 and, above all, a tireless selling of the becutiful "Wings for Norway" pins to the tune of 545 pins for \$545.00 ... Mrs. Nubson's grand total in this manner at present stands at \$625.00 ... - What a spirit. May we all take inspiration from her unselfish example ...- ...-

THE SPIRIT OF SEATTLE" One of the CLNA Directors had apportunity during a business trip to the West Coast to contact the Leaders of CLNA Northwest Pacific Division. He returned to Minneapolis Enthusiastic over the progressive, militant spirit of the work done on the Coast. Under Mr. J. M. Osmond's exceptional leadership, these Divisional leaders will prove themselves able to "spark-plug" the Northwest Pacific into the National lead within CLNA. Best wishes. ...

The President of our chapter, Mr. Olaf Halvorson, has been travelling around the country.
