A prefix to names and designations of people. Used to represent the sound *a* or *ah* in foreign words. An initial particle. Used with 12,810.

阿香 name of a fairy who assists 雷公 the God of Thunder by pushing his car.

阿嬌 baby name of the beautiful wife of 武帝 of the Han Dynasty. See 13,34.

阿娘 a mother. Read *o¹ niang* by Manchus as meaning "a mother," if the lady is a 妻 wife and not a concubine. Manchu: *enye*.

阿姐 an elder sister. Also used by the Manchus for "mother," if the lady is a 妻 concubine.

阿哥 a son of an Emperor of the present dynasty (from the Manchu word *aglh*); an elder brother.

阿公子 the eldest son of a nobleman.

阿恕迦 or **阿育** Asoka, the great Indian King who favoured Buddhism. B.C. 319.

阿勒台軍台 the military postroad from the Great Wall to the Altai Mountains.

阿迷州 a Department in the south-east of Yünnan.

阿羅漢 an Arhat, or Lo-han, i.e. one of the 500 disciples of Buddha. See 729¹.

阿魏 asafoetida.

阿嚏 to sneeze.

阿

家中有阿誰 who is that in the house? See 10,130.

唯之與阿相去幾何 between answering *wei* or *ah*, what a little difference there is! — and yet what a great one.

阿骨打 (*Hng*) Aguteng, founder of the Golden Dynasty. See 金 2032.

阿勾齊 Akouch'i, the 2nd or Mongol grade of Baturu.

阿婆 an old woman; a mother-in-law, — used by the son's wife.

阿婆湯 old woman's (hair) soup; — because when cold it takes shapes like their coiffures.

阿妹 my sister.

阿元 see **亞元** 12,810.

阿難 Ananda, — the cousin and faithful attendant of Gautama Buddha.

阿脩羅 the goblins of Buddhism, said to cause eclipses by defeating in battle the gods of light.

阿迦尼天 a great height in the air, — referring to Akanishta, the highest of the Buddhist worlds of visible form.

阿鼻 the last and worst of the eight hells of Buddhism.

阿毗曇 Abhidharma, — the philosophical division of the Buddhist canon.

阿浮達摩 Adbhuta dharma and **阿波陀那** Avadana, — two of the twelve divisions of the Buddhist Scriptures. See 4661.

阿僧祇 or **阿僧企耶** the highest possible number; innumerable. Sanskrit: *Asaṅkhyya*.

阿濕摩揭波 Sanskrit term for amber.

阿物兒 a superfine article, something better than others of its kind.

阿丹 Aden.

阿鶲 or **阿蘭** the skylark. Also, the crested lark.

大阿 the name of a magic sword.

Read *a¹*. Used for 2.

是阿 it is so indeed; yes, yes!

Read *a²*. An interjection, mostly of surprise.

你阿甚麼 what are you *ah-ing* at?

阿一聲 to utter an *ah!* — of astonishment.

Read *o¹*. A river bank; a mountain slope. Leaning towards; to assent; to flatter. See 3945.

阿丘 or **山之阿** a slope or hill side.

宿於崑崙之阿 to sleep upon the slope of the K'un-lun Mt.

無阿私 no partialities.

皇天無私阿兮 thou God, who art impartial!

性直諒不阿 of a straightforward disposition.

阿媚奉承 to toady and flatter.

未嘗阿附取悅 he did not flatter in order to curry favour.
