## I. UNION LISTS

The following union lists are invaluable, in particular the works of Chu Shih-chia. Items 1 (or 2, with 2a) and 4, in addition to their value as union lists of holdings in China and Japan respectively, also approach the ideal of including all extant gazetteers. Nevertheless, for each library, they need to be checked against the individual library catalogue of our Part II.

This is the first work to consult, both for its up-to-dateness and because it lists more gazetteers than any other work. Revised and expanded from his 1935 work (no.2), this union catalogue lists 7413 distinct gazetteers (excluding copies, but counting different editions for the same area as distinct). Including earlier supplementary entries and corrections to the 1935 work, 1581 extra distinct gazetteers are listed here, about 200 of them rare ones. Provinces with the largest number of gazetteers are Hopei, Kiangsu and Chekiang, Shantung and Szechwan.

This new work is basic as a list of extant gazetteers, for rare items in Japan or elsewhere, even though not found in the main 22 Chinese libraries covered, are still listed, where held being indicated in valuable notes. Nevertheless, for Japanese and other holdings outside China, one needs to consult other lists. This 1958 catalogue is thus most useful as a union list of holdings on the mainland. This is especially so now that several collections, private and public, have changed their name or been incorporated or amalgamated in other libraries (see Chu Shih-chia's preface; and the discussion of individual libraries in our Part II). The 1935 version is thus largely out of date.

The pre-war holdings of most of these libraries had already been covered by his 1935 lists, though sometimes in a different library or under a different name. The largest holdings are in Peking, though Nanking and Shanghai libraries are also specially rich in gazetteers. Some of the provincial libraries will hold more gazetteers than several listed above. Besides the 22 main libraries covered, rare items in 19 other Chinese libraries have been noted. For the following six libraries, the holdings of gazetteers of their own province have been incorporated in the main lists.
