History . . .

Since its organization at Plattsburg Barracks, New York, on May 17, 1933, Company 258 has occupied twelve different camp sites in eight states.

From June to October, 1933, the company occupied Camp Sheep Mountain Creek, Lewiston, Idaho; in October, the company moved to Camp Ala, Moulton, Alabama. During the summer of 1934, the company led all others in the Alabama, Cherokee and Pisgah National Forests for amount of work accomplished. In October 1934, the company changed station to Waterford, Mississippi, where it developed one of the finest camp sites in the South.

In July 1935, the outfit moved westward to Camp Tahoe, Tahoe City, California. Winter saw the wandering company again on the move, occupying Camp Reno, four miles south of Reno, Nevada on

Armistice Day. There the company remained for almost three years, its longest in any one camp, maintaining a side camp at Idlewild.

In August 1938, the outfit pulled up its stakes again, trekking down to Camp Inyokern, at Inyokern, California, in the wild and weird Death Valley country. Side camp were maintained at Isabella, west thru historic Walkers Pass, and at Lone Pine, on the lower slopes of Mt. Whitney, highest point in the country.

April 1939 brought a move to Camp Babb, Montana, in the Black-foot Reservation at the edge of Glacier Park, northernmost camp in the States. The Company moved to its present location, Camp Milk River, Malta, Montana in October.

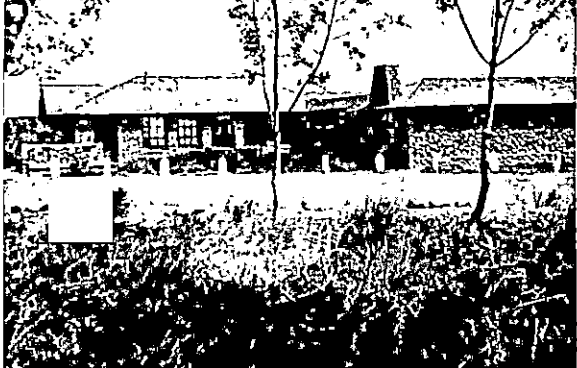

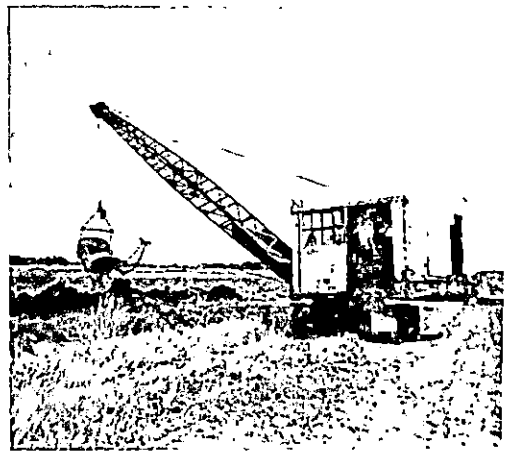

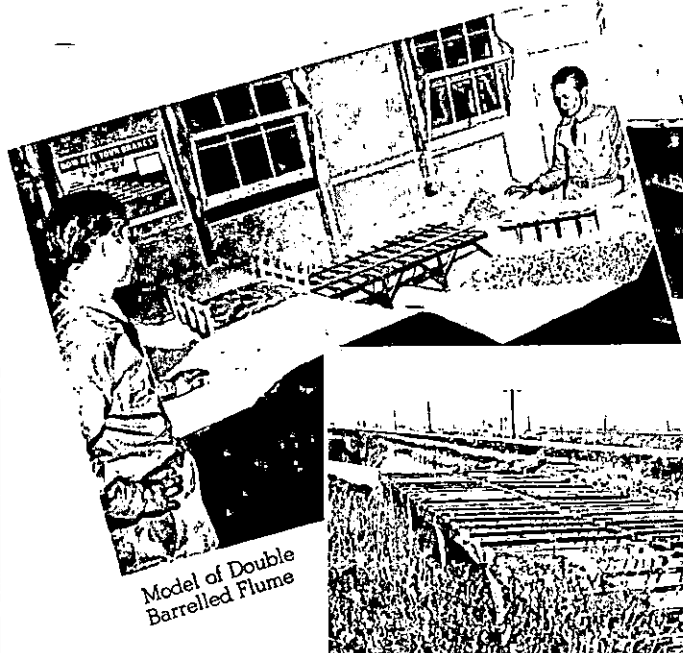

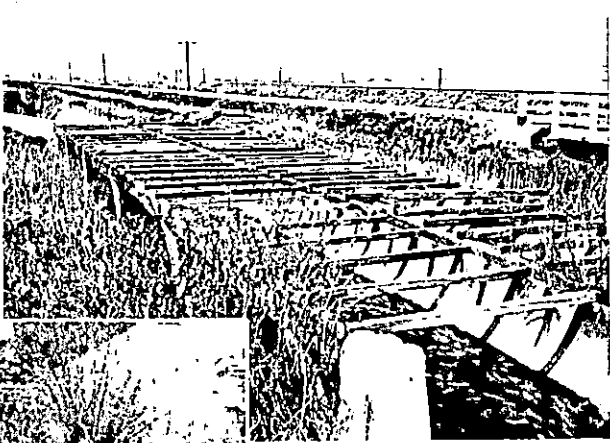
Operating Drag Line



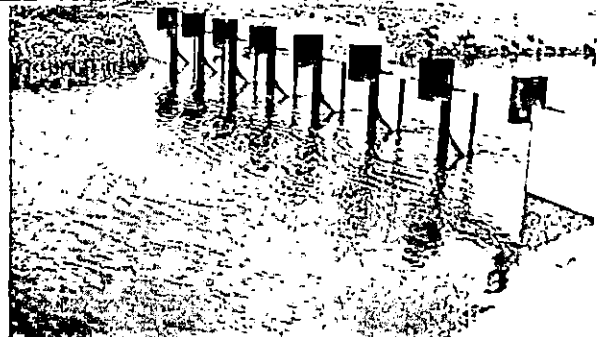

Model of Double Barrelled Flume



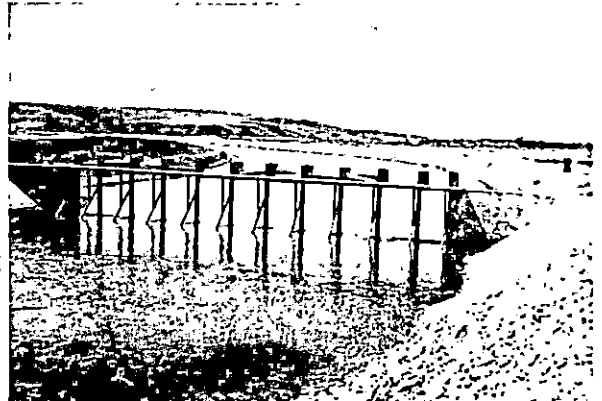

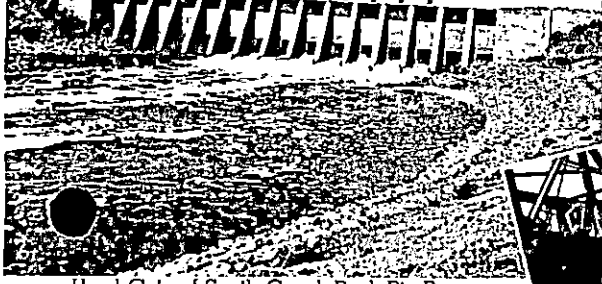

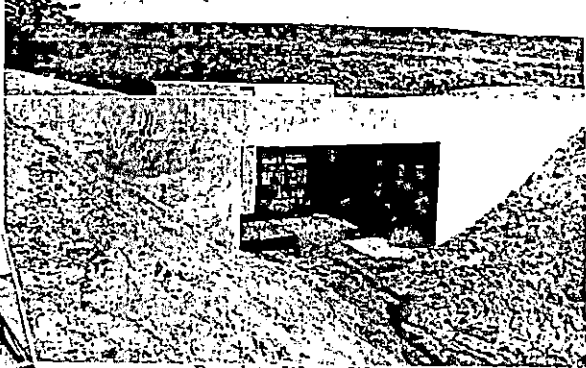

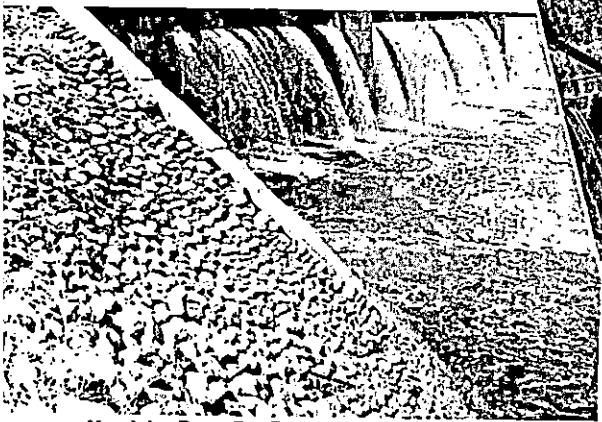

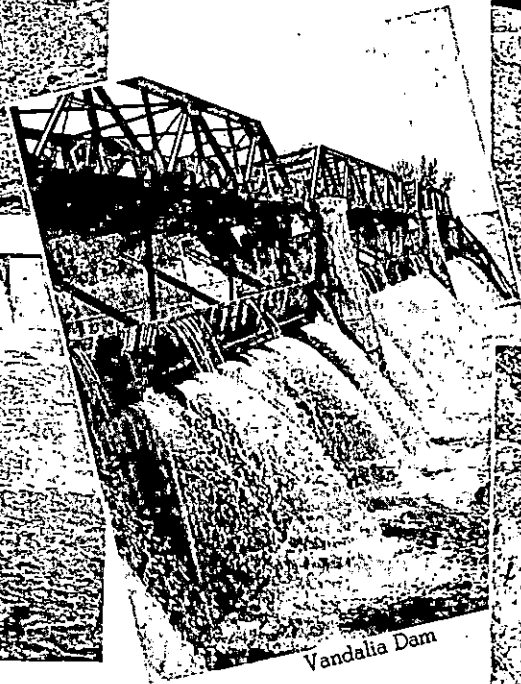

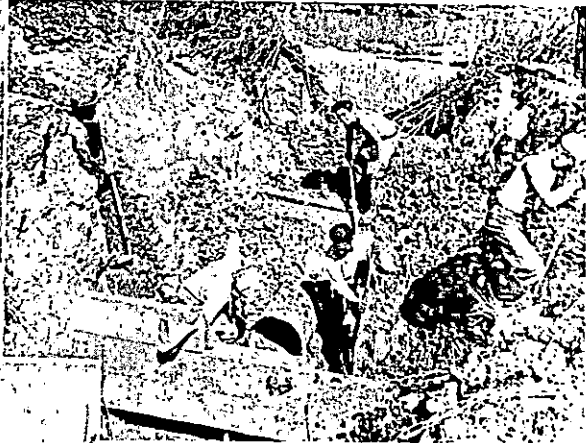

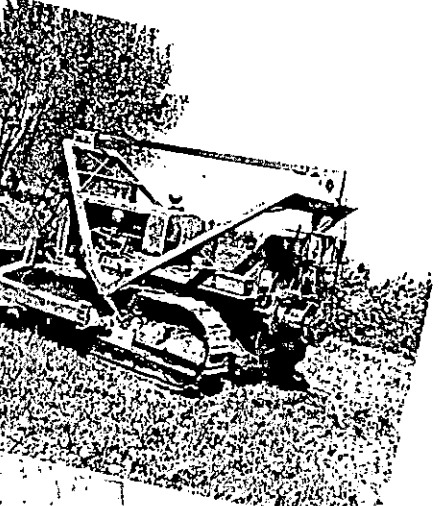

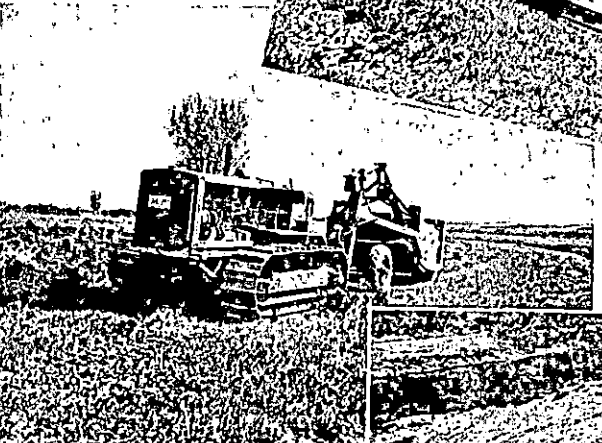
