## History . . .

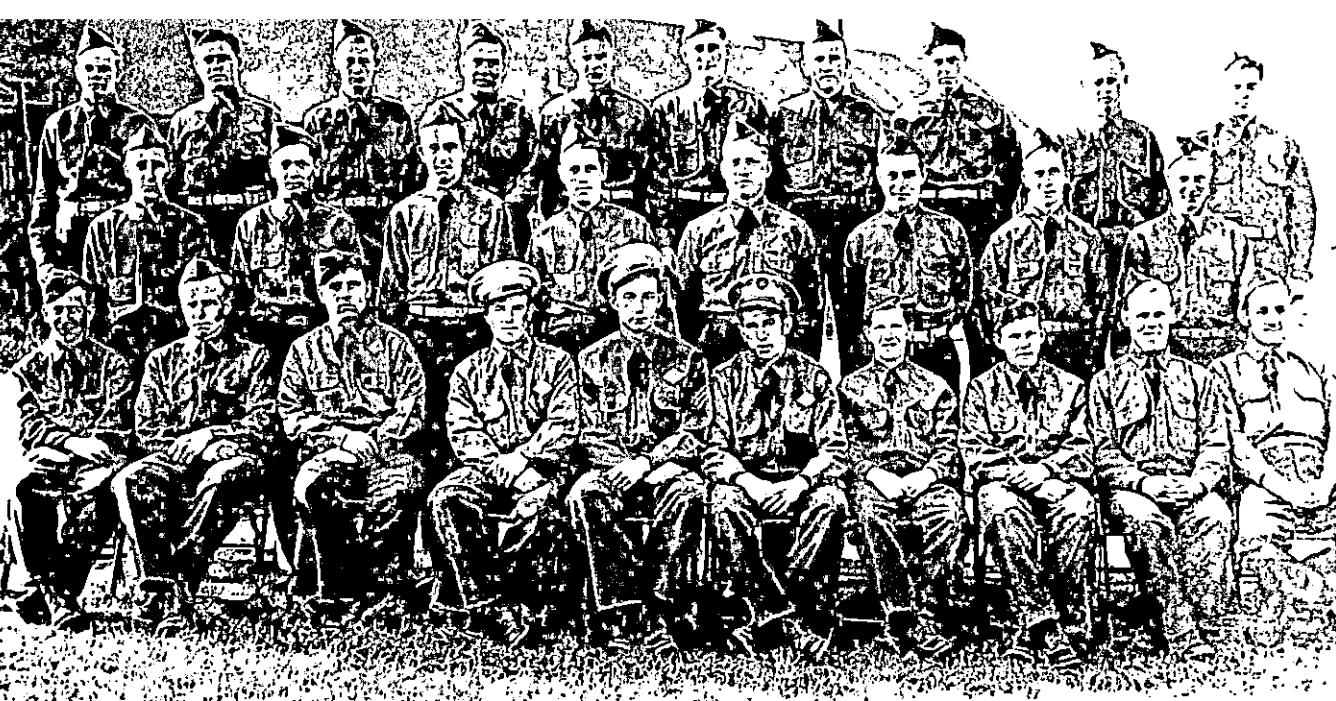
Company 535, COC was organized May 19, 1933, at Fort Knox, Kentucky, and consisted of one sergeant, two corporals, and one private, first class. The company's first permanent location was Lyous Valley, California. The first month in Lyous Valley was spent in preparing for the first enrollment of 183 men.

Movements were from Lyous Valley to Minersville, California, to Havre, Montana, and then to the present site in Yellowstone Park, Wyoming.

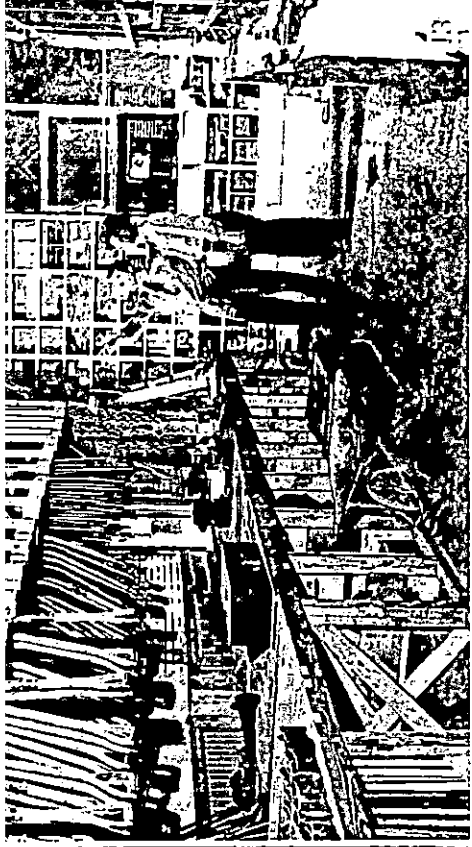
