The Company was established at Camp San Antonio Canyon, F-128, Upland, California. In April, 1934, the company was moved to Camp Magee, F-134, Spokane, Washington.

In October, of the same year, it was returned to Camp San Antonio Canyon, F-18. In May, 1935, to Camp Magee, F-134, Spokane, Washington. In October, 1935, to Camp Tule Lake, BR-20, Merrill, Oregon. In April, 1936, Camp Lava Beds, NM-6, Merrill, Oregon. In October, 1936, to Camp Praire Creek, SP-8, Orick, California. In June, 1937, Canyon Camp, YNP-2, Wyoming. In October, to Camp Glen Creek, NP-7, Mammoth Hot Springs, Wyoming. It has remained in that location until the present date. At present, Mr. Donald R. Skelton is Commanding.
