My dear Col:

Your letter enclosing one from the Japanese, has been received. I will take great pleasure, as soon as he reports to me, in giving him a thorough examination, and if the work here is suitable to his taste, I will immediately put him to work here, or send him to Baton Rouge.

I also enclose a letter received from Prof. J. P. d'Albuquerque, Barbados, W.I., asking if a colored youth would be admitted to our institution. I have made reply to it and told him that under the laws of our State, separate schools are provided for the races, and that his friend could not be admitted.

I thank you for the letter just received, and will write you in a day or two personally.

The boys from the University are getting on very well here, I am giving a good deal of my time to the supervision of their work. We will open the sugar house day after to-morrow, and after that time all the students will be engaged in the regular and systematic work of the sugar house.
