this connection, although they were not negroes. Mr. Tiglao may  
stay here and not be molested at all, but again the students may  
suddenly take a notion that he should not be allowed in the bar-  
racks. I explained this to Mr. Tiglao very frankly when he came  
here in the summer and have spoken to him several times about it  
recently. He understands the situation, but he says that he wants  
to stay in the barracks so he will have an opportunity to learn to  
speak English. I hope that he will have no unpleasant experiences  
during the year, but I am telling you this at this time so you  
will understand the situation. He seems to be a very earnest stu-  
dent and anxious to do his school work, and I have no doubt that he  
will make a satisfactory record in his classes.
