Thomas Jefferson's Inventions. Thomas Jefferson invented the folding campstool, the revolving office chair, the two-wheeled sulky, the copying press, the pedometer, a hemp lamp and a very convenient improvement on the plows used in his day. Of all these ingenious contrivances the plow received the greatest notice, a gold medal having been awarded it in Paris in 1790. Eighteen years later the Royal Agricultural Society of the Seine, to which he had presented the original plow, sent him a superb, up-to-date plow containing his improvement.
