

Peer Review: Proposal Argument Presentation

1. What was really working in this presentation? (Explanations, descriptions, information, tone, medium, arrangement, images, etc.)
2. What is most compelling/interesting/enlightening about the problem/solution?
3. Respond to the author's question.
4. As the presenter continues to work on this project, what are some questions, thoughts, or suggestions they ought to consider (this can be *new questions* to research, *further aspects* to explore, *complications* to address, where to expand/cut, consider the target audience, etc.)

Reflect/Revise. Once you have completed peer review, respond to the following questions and post on the Peer Review blog. Use the remaining time to work on revisions.

1. Now that you have heard your draft read aloud and received feedback, what advice is most helpful?
2. How do you plan to address this?
3. What is the most effective part of your presentation so far?
4. What will be your focus for revision (1-3 points) and what is your plan to address them?
