PREFACE

This bibliography attempts to include all works of professional interest published in America or by Americans anywhere in 1956, in the fields of linguistics, literature, folklore, and pedagogy. It was compiled by the MLA Slavic and Eastern European Bibliography Committee and the AATSEEL Bibliography Committee, in response to the general feeling that such a bibliography should be available in one place. The first, general, section of the bibliography has been expanded to include a broad coverage of works which may be of interest to the specialist in the field.

Scope. In addition to listing books and articles published in America or by Americans in 1956, the bibliography includes book reviews published in 1956 in selected professional periodicals specializing in the above-mentioned area. Reviews are listed under the entry for the book reviewed; if the reviewed book appeared before 1956, it is nevertheless included in the bibliography, with an indication of the date of publication. Belles-lettres are included only in cases of scholarly or textbook editions, or of reviews in professional publications. "America" for the purposes of this bibliography includes all the Americas, and "Americans" includes not only those who have permanent residence in this hemisphere, but also scholars who taught here during 1956. There have been a few instances of publications listed which were dated 1955, but which actually appeared in 1956; these instances are noted in the entries.

Use of the Bibliography. All books, articles, and reviews listed were published in 1956, unless there is specific indication otherwise. Numbers in square brackets [] refer to numbers in this bibliography. The letter "R" in the Index of Authors, after a number, refers to a book review listed under that number in the bibliography. Authors are indexed under an Anglicized transliteration, when such a transliteration appears in the bibliography proper.

Under each of the main sections of the bibliography, the order of the materials is arranged as follows:

Miscellaneous

- Slavic: Russian, Ukrainian, Belorussian, Polish, Czech, Slovak, Bulgarian, Serbo-Croatian, Slovene
- Baltic: Lithuanian, Latvian
- Other Indo-European: Albanian, Modern Greek, Rumanian, Yiddish
- Non-Indo-European: Finnish, Estonian, Lapp, Cheremis, Ob-Ugric, Hungarian, Mongolian.

Latin-alphabet spellings in titles have been strictly followed, though this has resulted in numerous instances (e.g., with Dostoevskij) in a number of different spellings in the text. Titles of books and articles in Cyrillic have been transliterated using the system followed in The Slavic and East European Journal. When the translation of a title appears on or opposite the title page or contents page of the work, that translation is included in this bibliography, in parentheses, after the title in the original language. Underlining for italics has been avoided, except when necessary for clarity.

Names of all periodicals are given in full, with the exception of the following, where a short form was adopted for the sake of space:

The Editorial Committee of the Slavic and East European Series of Indiana University has approved plans for publishing an annual bibliography in this field. Authors and publishers are invited to send copies of publications and bibliographical data to the Editor, to insure inclusion in the Bibliography for 1957. If a scholar prefers a particular Anglicization of the spelling of his name, this spelling will be used henceforth, providing that he will inform the Editor. Items inadvertently omitted in this bibliography will be included in the bibliography for 1957, if they are called to the attention of the Editor.
