He has for the past four years been staff consultant to the project, Religious Freedom and Public Affairs of the National Conference of Christians and Jews. He formerly served for seven years as Director of the National Department of Inter-Religious Cooperation of the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, where he was editor of the Christian Friends Bulletin. Ordained at the Jewish Institute of Religion in New York in 1951, he pursued his graduate studies at the National Psychological Association for Psychoanalysis and is registered as a psychiatric social worker with the New York State Department of Health.

DR. DUMONT F. KENNY

Dr. Dumont is president of Queensborough Community College of the City University of New York. Prior to this appointment in 1963, he had served for ten years as vice president for program development of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, and he continues to serve the NCCF as a consultant for national program development. He holds a B.S. degree from Fordham University and a Ph.D. from the University of Chicago. Prior to entering the army in 1942 he headed the Education Department at the publishing firm of P. J. Kenedy & Sons. In 1945 he headed a military government project which produced 5,000,000 German textbooks free of Nazi ideology for use in German schools. A native of New York, he has spent extended periods in Florida and in the Midwest.

DR. J. ROBERT NELSON

Dr. Nelson was appointed Professor of Systematic Theology at the Boston University School of Theology this year. He had previously been Fairchild Professor of Christian Theology at Oberlin College. He has also taught at Princeton and at Vanderbilt, where he resigned in an act of protest over racial discrimination. Since 1948 he has been much occupied with the Ecumenical Movement. He was for four years executive secretary of the Commission on Faith and Morals of the World Council of Churches in Geneva, Switzerland. He is editor-at-large of The Christian Century, a member of the American Theological Society and a minister of the Methodist Church. He took his A.B. at DePauw University, his B.D. at Yale and his Doctorate in Theology at the University of Zurich, Switzerland.
