PRESENTED BY LA AS SUBJECT**

Come experience the diversity of stories that make Southern California such a place of discovery. At the Los Angeles Archives Bazaar, presented by L.A. as Subject and the USC Libraries, anyone with an interest in the region's history will find something of value. A broad array of institutions and archives will have experts on hand to show off their collections and answer questions—from the Autry National Center of the American West and the Los Angeles Public Library to private collectors whose materials fill the gaps left in the region's history. More than 70 archives will be represented at this event, which is free and open to the public.

In addition, the bazaar will feature: an archives roadshow, where guests can bring historic photos or documents to be digitized; panels featuring specialists discussing L.A.'s "magical" year of 1939 and the monsters that lurk throughout Southern California; and a screening of *Monomaniacs*, a documentary sponsored by Cal Humanities and airing on KCET about the motives and passions of collectors.
